A. M. Brodie of the First Presbyterian church. Rev. Brodie was giving the annual reception to the congregation of his church when the couple applied to him to marry them. They were taken into his study and the knot tied. They will reside in Kingman, where Mr. Ash is engaged in the newspaper business."

Mrs. Cline left Larned quietly, leaving her millinery store in charge of Miss Gail Buckles. It is understood that her store is for sale. Mr. Ash was employed on this paper for some months until about a year ago, and is well known here. His bride has lived here most of her life, and has a large circle of friends, whose best wishes go with her and her husband to their new home at Kingman, where Mr. Ash is employed on the Kingman Journal.
