<p>Timothy Hays died Friday at 1:30 p. m. at his home on East Yerby. Mr. Hays, as mentioned last week, was taken suddenly ill Sunday, week, while eating dinner. As he was 72 years old, his chances for recovery were poor and he lingered until Friday.</p> <p>Mr. Hays was born in Waterford County, Ireland, in 1835, and came to Chillicothe, Ohio, as a young man remained there till about 1867 when he came to Saline with his family. His wife preceded him in death about six years ago.
